TASTING NOTES

Colour:	Brilliant ruby colour with violet edges.
Aroma:	Strawberries, raspberries and ripe fruit with touch of pepper and spices aromas.
Taste:	In mouth, flavours of red fruit, spice and hints of vanilla from aging in French oak. Round, soft tannins lead to a delicate, lingering finish.
Food:	Ideal with light meats such as poultry, and is also delicious with tomato-based pasta sauces and hard cheeses.
