The small crop 2008 vintage was a nail-biter, but the wines are admired for their purity and elegance. Red and black fruit, subtle grilled bell pepper, cigar box and graphite complexity are the hallmarks of a nicely evolved, harmonious cabernet. For more than 30 years, Hawk Crest has produced approachable, fruit-forward wines of high quality and fine value. Winemaker Mark Smith puts some 10,000 miles on his vehicle during the growing season, searching for and selecting specific vineyards in some of California's most promising wine regions for the grapes that go into Hawk Crest wines. This Cabernet Sauvignon combines the best of Lake County's hillside vineyards in the Red Hills appellation, with the bright fruit grown in the Paso Robles appellation. The result is a wine that is varietally true, well-structured, food-friendly and a pleasure to drink.
